*“Home of the Blues & Birthplace of Rock’n’Roll”*

Memphis is the birthplace of rock ‘n’ roll and the home of the Blues. It’s also home to the National Civil Rights Museum, Beale Street, the Memphis Rock and Soul Museum, the National Ornamental Metal Museum, and Graceland, the second most visited residence in the United States. Memphis became a music mecca in the 1950s and ‘60s with Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Carl Perkins and Jerry Lee Lewis, among others, all recording at Sun Studios. Memphis still has a vibrant music scene to this day, with live music each night on Beale Street and in most areas of the city. Memphis abounds with deep roots, from the Old Growth Forest in Overton Park to the 4,500 acres in Shelby Farms Park. There are plenty of great places to eat but don’t forget to try the BBQ Pork.
